Marlina Moreno, a former San Diego Charger Girl, spends her weekends dancing at a California nightclub to fund her travels to far-off locales as a wildlife conservationist.

"When I'm in the jungle with no makeup on, people don't expect me to be half-naked dancing at nightclubs," the 24-year-old brunette bombshell told Caters News Agency.

"And when I'm at home dancing, people tend to be surprised to find out I travel and spend months in the wilderness."

Moreno, who was featured in Sports Illustrated, ditched the Chargers' squad after visiting the South African jungle in 2012.
